My husband and I do not have children by choice and I live a simple, no fuss life as I don't like cooking and



### MP Report - Tom Lukiwski

There is a scandalous story in the news about foreign interests trying to influence the outcome of a legitimate election in a Western democratic country. But it isn't the story you probably think it is.

It is generally assumed that the 2015 Canadian federal election was part of the natural course of political events – that Canadians had become dissatisfied with the Conservative government and were spontaneously drawn to the charms of Justin Trudeau's campaign. As it turns out, this was not entirely true.

According to a 32-page complaint submitted to Elections Canada , there is evidence that the outcome of the federal election was, to some degree, bought and paid for by deep-pocketed American lobby groups. The Tides Foundation, an anti-oil environmentalist group, carried out an extensive campaign to bring down the Conservative government.

The Tides Foundation set up a network of third-party groups that operated much like American political action committees (PACs). Canadian electoral law strictly limits how much

third-party groups can spend during elections but the Tides Foundation is alleged to have circumvented these limits by helping to create dozens of inter-connected third-party groups.

These groups spent over \$6 million in the 2015 campaign, much of which came from US sources and \$1.5 million of which was donated directly by the Tides Foundation itself

A prominent third-party group in this spider's web was an organization called Leadnow. This organization and its

affiliates are alleged to have worked on two fronts. First, it ran a national campaign aimed at encouraging strategic voting. Second, it operated a grassroots campaign, flying out political advisers and campaign workers to targeted ridings throughout the country.

Leadnow's activities were so alarming that even the NDP complained of them, since many of their activities were aimed at draining away NDP vote in favour of the Liberals. And Leadnow was so brazen about

their activities that they actually bragged about them afterwards to their American sponsors.

Step back for a minute and put the word "Russian" in place of "American" and you can easily see what an outrage this is. It represents the most serious threat to electoral sovereignty in Canadian history. While this scandal has not gained much public attention, Yves Cote, the commissioner of Elections Canada has launched an official investigation. Former Elections Canada commissioner Jean-Pierre Kingsley has lent his support, describing the influence of foreign money in the 2015 election as "unacceptable.

As citizens, we also all have a duty to stand up for our democracy. If they have integrity, the Liberal government must be prepared to bite the hand that feeds them. I would like to encourage all Saskatchewan residents to call and write Minister Ralph Goodale and demand that the Liberal government introduce legislation to curtail the influence of foreign money on Canadian elections.
