WHEELS OF FORTUNE!

It's 6 am! Gary Grady and Sharon Miskolczi's feet hit the floor and they're off and running. There is a lot of prep work to be done before he and his partner can begin to open for business. There are salads to prepare, supplies to be stocked, slow cookers to carry on board, and inspecting the truck to ensure all will go glitch-free before they head to Saskatoon. Their business on wheels is Poor Gary's Po' Truck!

This new venture started when Gary and Sharon were visiting a mutual friend in Moose Jaw, who also owns a food truck - Rebel Melt Grilled Cheese. He put a bug in Gary's ear and the next thing Gary knew, he was driving home in a 1972 Chevy milk truck. They started to draft a menu with Sharon creating recipes, while both worked on the truck, re-finishing the interior and exterior, choosing a colour for the truck, and Gary fabricating embellishments to the exterior of the truck. Three months later, they were



open for business!

The food truck theme is Tex/Mex Fusion, a created Mexican and Texan style pulled pork. They made their debut June 16 at the Hanley Ag Fair but are usually found in Saskatoon with their location determined by the weather. If it's sunny and hot, you can find them on 22nd Street catering to the foot traffic. If it's cloudy, they are usually on 8th Street or 51st Street because there is more vehicle traffic willing to stop for their lunch.

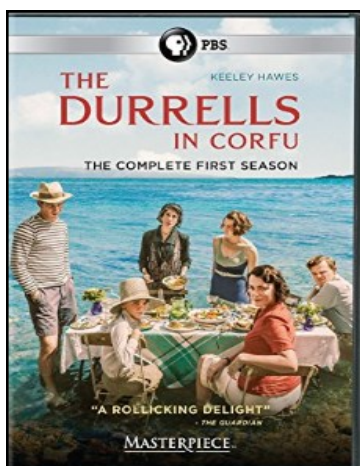
It's easy to find them, not only because of the colour of the truck, a rich orange; but because Sharon posts their location on FaceBook and Gary installed a GPS locator in the truck. Once they get to their location, Gary flips on a switch. You

only need to locate them via a smart phone App called "Snack Map" which will lead you to them at any time.

Their business has grown in popularity, as they are the most invited food truck to attend events by the Saskatoon Food Truck Association. However their season is just about over. Poor Gary's Po' Truck will operate until the end of October before they close for the winter.

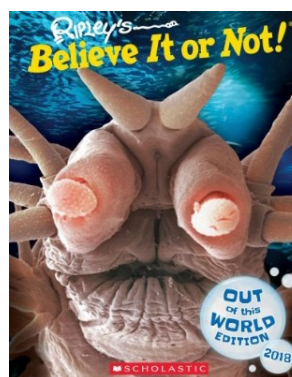
Until then, next time you're in Saskatoon and need a quick bite to eat, check them out via Snack Maps!

After many back and forth negotiations with SGI we have settled

on \$8,800 for value on the total loss of the towns stolen 2001 one-ton truck. Public Works is sourcing a replacement truck asap before snow comes.

Council was contacted regarding speeding and to consider having a path or walkway built along the trees down Railway Ave. as more and more people are using the street to travel to the store or over to the walking trails at Sunshine Meadows. Railway is a very busy street with many drivers speeding down it and it's not safe for kids riding their bikes to school etc. Administration is contacting CN Rail regarding regulations and the process for access to their property for a bike/walking trail. If that side of Railway Ave. is not an option we will look at the east side of the road. Railway Ave. was built as a heavy haul road with no walking area as it was thought foot/bike traffic would prefer to use Gov't Road.

The rink will open Oct 1. A big THANKS to the DMHA volunteers who get the rink ready for

the hockey season. We really appreciate all that you do.

Speeding along Third St and Railway Ave. has been an ongoing problem. I attend the Elected Officials meeting with the RCMP on a quarterly basis and their suggestion is that if you see some one speeding, call the RCMP and let them know. If you can give them a plate number, better yet. The more complaints the more action, such as a radar set up. Council has zero authority to stop speeders. We can try to limit speeding using speed bumps or digital radar signs but calling in speeders, especially if you have their plate number, is the truly effective way.

Canadian Paving returned to sweep some extra gravel from the chip seal paving done earlier this summer. All of Second Ave was newly chip sealed before it deteriorated beyond repair. The pavement was over 30 years old and maintenance was needed. The cost was \$19,000 plus taxes. We really like the product and will work towards having all gravel streets in town chip sealed.

The Saskatoon RC Club made

a presentation to Council and the Rink Committee to use the Curling Rink side of the arena and retrofit the area into an indoor track. The club made an excellent presentation and we approved the use of the curling rink. We are excited to help bring some different type of activities for kids and families to do together for fun and competition. The Club is looking to having the track up and running within the next few months.

I'd like to congratulate our MLA Bronwyn Eyre with her appointment to Minister of Education in August and wish her much success in her endeavours.

Lord willin' and the crick don't rise, there will be a Meet and Greet with our MLA Bronwyn Eyre and Scott Moe, a leadership candidate for the Sask. Party, on Oct. 2, 2017 at the Hall from 4:00 – 5:00 PM. Come out and say hi and have a cup of coffee.

Dundurn's Fall Supper is Sunday October 29. This event brings 500+ people to the community. It'll be good eatin' so hope to see you there. Until next time, have a great day, eh?

THE RIGHT PLACE

Art is subjective. There is a kind of magic that happens when the visual information moves from the eye to the brush. It's an intuitive process. Artist Gale Hagblom had that natural ability when she first picked up a brush at age six, which led her to earn an honours degree in Fine Arts from NSCAD University.

Gale chose this college out of the four leading art schools in Canada for two reasons: it was internationally renowned

and therefore, artists from all over the world travelled to Halifax to earn their degree, and for its historical value as it is one of the oldest art schools in Canada. She felt privileged to earn a spot beside artists from around the world, such as England, Korea, France and Italy. She explained her studies were challenging as the best teachers and students critiqued everything you did.

After earning her degree in fine art and a diploma from the Banff Centre in Graphic Design, Gale later earned her Master's in Geography and Planning. This brought

her to our town when she was hired as the town's planning consultant.

As her relationship with Town Council and Administrator grew, she learned that there was a space available for rent in the basement of the Town office building. That was when she packed up her brushes, canvases, and paints and transformed the room into a bright and spacious art studio. As she spends more time in the town, she has become attached to it and appreciates the opportunity to paint in a beautiful historical building that allows her to be inspired and creative.

Gale has a busy life; she is a member of the Canadian Institute of Planners as well as the Canadian Artist Representation (CARFAC); the Saskatchewan Arts Board; and the City of Saskatoon's Public Art Advisory Committee. Every two years she plans a series of works for an art exhibition. Her latest exhibition was held at the U of S this past June. But she has created a routine and balances her life as a parent, wife, daughter, artist and planner.

She welcomes all to visit her in her studio. Her hours are Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10am to 3pm and depending on how busy her schedule is, one afternoon during the weekend.

2nd Home Routes House Concert - Featuring Tannis Slimmon

Tannis Slimmon is a critically acclaimed Canadian musician who has been singing, song-writing, recording, and touring locally, nationally, and internationally for over 30 years. In 2008 she was honoured with the Contemporary Vocalist of the Year at the Canadian Folk Music Awards for her album [Lucky Blue](#).

Tannis grew up in a musical family on a farm in the prairies of western Canada. In 1980 she moved to Guelph ON where she began a serious professional music career. During the 80's and 90's she was a founding member of various regional roots bands (the Reverbs, Benji, etc), and appeared as a special guest on recordings and performances with key players in the CanRock Revolution. (Rheostatics, Barenaked Ladies, Grievous Angels)

After eleven years with the legendary trio The Bird Sisters she struck off on her own in 2001 with her solo debut [Oak Tree](#) and followed it up with 2007's award winning [Lucky Blue](#) and 2013's [In and Out of Harmony](#). All her albums are highly regarded by critics and audiences alike with the latest being described as 'infectious, uplifting and thought-provoking all at the same time' (Beatroute) and, 'an honest and endearing addition to an already impressive catalogue' (Penguin Eggs).

Tannis traveled to Mali, West Africa in 2004 with a quartet of musicians exploring the role of music in development and appears in the documentary of the trip [Road to Baleya](#), by Bay Waymen. She subsequently visited Matanzas, Cuba where she studied afro-Cuban rhythms with master bata drummer Gilberto Morales-Chong. She has hosted Malian musicians in her home for two summers as part of an ongoing cultural exchange. Her experiences in Mali and Cuba have had a significant influence on the musical texture of her recent album "Lucky Blue".

You will find Tannis' name on over 85 albums, contributing songs or singing harmonies for others including David Francey, Willie P. Bennett, Valdy and Rheostatics. Tannis plays guitar, mandolin, bass and percussion but it's her singing that she is most known for. She performs solo, in a duo with Lewis Melville, in a trio called Boreal, and in the vocal collective the Ondine Chorus. She has performed at folk clubs, festivals and community centres across Canada. Her music can be heard on public and college radio across North America.

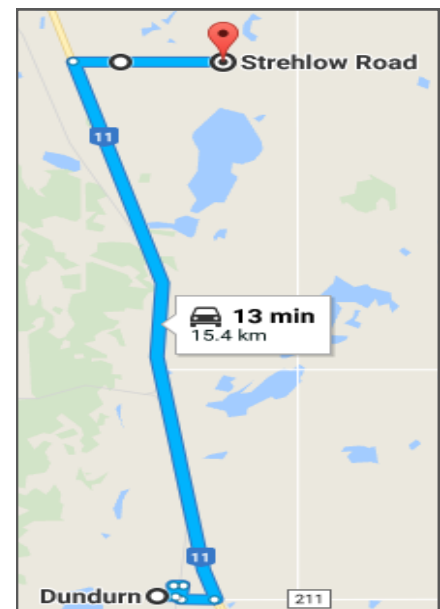

WINGS OF HOPE!

They sit in a circle all sharing a different yet similar story. This is 'Wings of Hope' - a breast cancer peer support group led by Deb Boehm (Dundurn) pictured and Jody Libke (Hanley). The first series of gatherings in the area for women touched with breast cancer that was held on September 18 at Hanley United Church.

An increase of breast cancer has become more evident as a result of better detection through the breast screening program. Mammograms can now detect a lump as small as a pin head, resulting in early diagnose of the disease at its beginning stages. Resulting in more survivor's, but unfortunately, they lack the support.

Deb realized there was a need for a support group for surviving women in our communities, when one day she was at the Hanley curling rink and spotted Jody, who is also a survivor. As they started to talk, conversation turned to their personal experiences with cancer. Deb was thankful that their paths had crossed. It was from that initiate conversation, Wings of Hope was formed.

Support for these women is crucial! They gather and talk about their experiences with cancer from the beginning, emotional roller coaster ride; to the experiences with treatment; to coping



mechanisms that help them deal with having the disease. "Unless you go through it - you don't know how it feels" stated Deb Boehm, who was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2011.

When the manager of the Canadian Cancer Society encouraged Deb to start a group in her community, she contacted Jody and the two of them attended a three-day facilitation course in Calgary

sponsored by the Canadian Cancer Society.

"Know your body!" Deb stated. If you or anyone you know requires support, the next scheduled meetings will be held:

October 3 at Dundurn United Church and **October 17** at Hanley United Church. For more information please contact Deb 306-371-8895 or Jody at 306-222-5394.





Happy fall, everyone!

From early learning and Pre-K to K-12 and post-secondary, students of all ages—from rural

communities such as Dundurn to Saskatchewan's cities—have now returned to school.

The start of a new school year can be an exciting time for all students and staff, but it's particularly exciting for those who are now spending their days in brand-new environments. Thousands of students and staff are settling in at 21

new schools across the province, including eighteen schools on nine joint-use sites in Regina, Saskatoon, Warman and Martensville.

With a growing population and ageing facilities, we're responding to the need for new and replacement schools by investing \$1.5 billion in new capital projects.

This means:

40 new schools
25 major renovations; and
repairs and renos to more than half of all schools in the province.

During Saskatchewan's decade of growth, student enrolment has increased by 10

per cent, while the operating funding provided to school divisions increased by 32 per cent. Our government has also hired 875 new teachers, an increase of 10 per cent.

We have also added 6,000 new daycare spaces, an increase of 62 per cent. This year's budget includes funding for 889 new child care spaces. The majority of these spaces are included in the new schools in some of Saskatchewan's fastest-growing communities.

To all parents, educators and support staff, thank you for everything you do. Best wishes for a successful school year!

constructed a plan to purchase the truck as the need for a new one in our growing community was becoming imperative.

In order to accommodate the new vehicle, renovations had to be done at the existing fire hall, as well as, modifications made to the new truck in order for the vehicle to fit in the door.

At the beginning of January 2017, renovations commenced, with the bulk of the renovations being fulfilled by the firefighters and first responders themselves.

Renovations wasn't the only project that kept the team busy. The team has monthly meetings to attend, as well as, internal / external training in conjunction with the Saskatoon Health Region for the volunteer's medical training, and countless volunteer standby / on-call events. All while committing their service as firefighters and first responders to the Dundurn and area

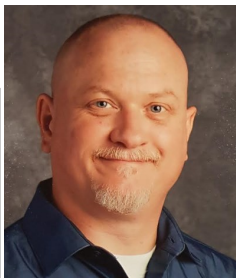

There just seems to be something in the Liberal Party's DNA that makes them blind to the needs of Western Canada and particularly of Prairie farmers. This is obvious in Justin Trudeau's clumsy attempts to reform corporate tax laws which are aimed at the super-rich but, through their incompetent design, end up penalizing middle-class business owners including farmers.

It goes without saying that farming is and always will be full of risks and uncertainties. The most prudent and successful farmer can see his entire earnings for a year wiped out in a single season or a single day through drought, flood, hail or disease.

To manage these risks and stay in business, farmers and the financial advisors who assist them must be able to access every income and capital planning tool possible. For decades, farmers have been encouraged by everyone, including by government officials, to incorporate as a means of managing their

finances. With that in mind, it's clear that the Liberal's tax changes are a betrayal of the farming community that contributes so much to our country.

The Liberal's proposed changes will hurt farmers in many ways:

- The changes would block farmers from using dividends from the farming corporation to pay for their children's post-secondary education.
- The rules generally make it difficult and risky for farmers to share farm income among family members.
- They would interfere in succession planning by creating a higher tax bill for farmers to pass on land to their children than to a stranger.
- The new rules make it more difficult to guard against crop failure by discouraging farmers from retaining cash in the farm corporation.

There is a great irony in these proposed changes: they are aimed at cracking down on major corporations and high-income earners. Instead, they will have the effect of undermining the family farm which

will result in much more farmland ending up in the hands of conglomerates and pension plans.

But while farmers will be among the hardest hit by the Liberals' ham-fisted tax grabs, they are not the only ones. Small business owners will find it harder to manage their savings and their capital. Incorporated tradespeople will face regulatory risks. Some of the most valuable professionals in our society, such as doctors and engineers, will be penalized simply for carrying out prudent business practices.

Prime Minister Trudeau and Finance Minister Morneau seem to have the attitude that this is all just a big misunderstanding and that, if they just wait it out, all the fuss will blow over. In the meantime, even their own caucus members are starting to rebel against them.

Make sure that they keep getting the message. I encourage constituents to call and write Ralph Goodale, the Prime Minister and the Finance Minister to let them know that these tax changes are a threat that Western Canada takes seriously and that we will not take them sitting down.

Thanksgiving Side Dish



Roasted Brussel Sprouts with Bacon, Mustard Vinaigrette

Ingredients:

1 1/2 lbs Brussel sprouts halved

3 Tbsp extra-virgin olive oil
Salt & freshly ground pepper
8 oz slab bacon, cut into lardoons
1/2 cup walnuts, coarsely chopped
2 Cloves Garlic
2 shallots, sliced
2 Tbsp red wine vinegar
1 Tbsp honey
1 Tbsp grainy mustard

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 450 degrees F.

Toss the brussel sprouts with 2 TBSP of the oil and sprinkle with salt and pepper on a rimmed baking sheet. Spread the Brussel sprouts out on the baking sheet

and roast, stirring once or twice during the cooking process, until tender and charred in spots, 35-45 minutes.

Meanwhile, add the bacon to a medium sauté pan and render over medium heat, 1-2 min. Add the remaining 1 Tbsp oil, the walnuts, garlic, shallots, and a pinch of salt. Cook until the bacon is crispy, being careful not to burn the walnuts. Stir in the vinegar, honey and mustard with a fork. Whisk into the bacon fat until emulsified. Taste and season with salt and pepper.

Transfer the Brussel sprouts to a large mixing bowl, with the bacon mixture and toss well. Serve.

1 Town Complaint

Incessant barking dogs are the number one complaint in Town, according to Town Administrator Eileen Prosser. Many suffer in silence for years as they fear having enemies for neighbours and some just have a breaking point and can't take it anymore. The town does have a Bylaw Officer that comes bi weekly or on call, to investigate such matters if a resident completes a complaint form. No information regarding who made the complaint is shared with anyone except the Bylaw Officer, and if the matter ends up in court, possibly then. According to the Town Administrator, a visit from the Bylaw Officer regarding a barking dog almost



guarantees a call into the office by an upset pet owner. People are very passionate about their animals; it's almost like a

stranger telling them their child is bad. But people have a right to the quiet enjoyment of their property and that's hard to do when dogs are continually barking at everything" stated Eileen. "The town's only recourse if it's found to be a noise violation is to fine the owner, the town has no authority to remove the animals."

After the initial warning from the Bylaw Officer, the town would hope that the owner fixes whatever the reason is for the dogs barking. "I'm no dog whisperer, but having a dog that isn't exercised properly or leaving it chained or outside all day with nothing to do, is most likely the route of most of the barking issues. Be a good neighbour and bring your dog inside."


