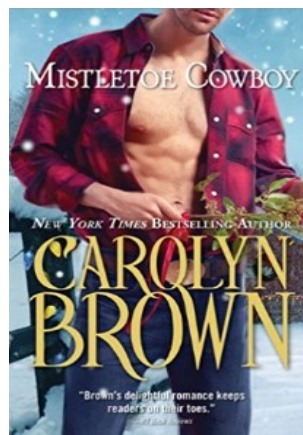

Gratitude! That's the key word, which led Jamie Coulson to write a children's book titled "Thank you for the Sun". The idea of writing a book originated when she was teaching her son about gratitude, a behaviour that one does not come by naturally.

When Jamie first thought about writing a book about the subject, she went to the one source who would give her honest answers - Her son, Hayden who was 5-years-old at the time. Jamie expressed how important it is to teach your children about gratitude, "When you teach them at a young age, it will become natural for them."

This is the message Jamie wanted to achieve when she started to write her book. Yet, she had to keep it easy to understand so that children could relate to subjects such as; a bed to sleep in, clothes to wear, and food to place on the table. Things we sometimes take for granted.

Training Day with SK Energy

On Nov 4th, SK Energy hosted a training session at Dundurn's Fire hall which brought in 48 volunteer fire-fighters under one roof to sit in on the session. This is the first time such a session has taken place in the area with such a large number in attendance.

One to three members from 18 Volunteer fire departments across Saskatchewan alongside Dundurn's attended as SK Energy presented training on how to deal with natural

gas in an emergency and know what to do before SK Energy arrives on the scene; STARS presentation on the role they play in emergencies; Saskatoon Volunteer Firefighter Association spoke about critical incident stress management; and EMFS (Emergency Management & Fire Safety) also spoke to the group about assistance they can provide to volunteer emergency departments.

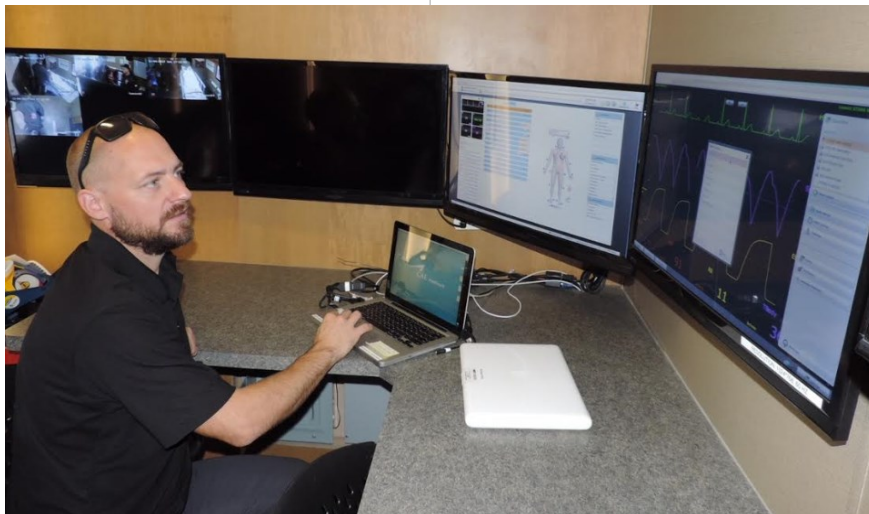
After the training session was completed, the group had a chance to explore the STARS education trailer which demonstrated an advanced mannequin named Stan. STARS Community Education Leader Luc Duval operates the human patient simulator to mimic complex medical and critical health care problems which health care workers may encounter one or two times per year.

The mannequin can speak, breath, blink, has reactive pupils, a heart-beat, and a pulse and can mirror human responses to procedures such as CPR, intravenous medication, intubation, ventilation, and catheterization. Duval uses a specialized computer to program Stan which creates different scenario's to be presented to health care workers for training.

STARS educational leaders travel with three mobile units replicating an emergency room, or the mannequins can be used in mock accident scenes. The units were donated by RBC to bring training to first responders and health care workers and to those who are faced with barriers of distance and who are unable to leave the community for training.

It's that time of year again when we need to offer a reminder about a few division policies regarding cold weather because we've had a taste of it already, and I think it's a safe bet that more of it's on its way before we see Spring.

Remind your students to wear the proper warm clothes to school again this season, for any of our students being picked up by bus. Bus Drivers do have the authority to refuse students entry to the bus if they don't have proper clothing for cold weather. In the case of a breakdown, all students should have proper clothing to ensure they are safe and warm on the bus while waiting for support to arrive.

While on the topic of bussing — a reminder that a combined temperature and wind chill that drops to minus 40 degrees will cancel buses for the day.

If a bus doesn't run in the morning, it will not run in the afternoon. Classes will never be cancelled on those days — the school is required to remain open for those students who do make it to school, including those whose parents drive them in.

The grade 11 and 12 students enjoyed another morning earlier this month at the annual Career Fair in Saskatoon. Planning should be well underway for students to narrow their options for careers or education following Grade 12. For those students who are still struggling with ideas, help is always available from myself, who can lead the students to directions to start looking for answers. Our government has introduced legislation invoking the Notwithstanding Clause of the Canadian Charter of

Rights and Freedoms to protect parents' choice when it comes to where they send their children to school.

The legislation is in response to a Court of Queen's Bench ruling that would have forced non-Catholic students out of Catholic schools.

The court's decision sets a worrying precedent that could threaten funding not only for students in Catholic schools, but also the 3,600 students attending 26 other faith-based schools in Saskatchewan.

We believe families should be able to choose where they send their children to school, regardless of their religious faith. The new legislation will maintain the current funding model that allows the government to fund students attending public or Catholic separate schools, regardless of their religious affiliation.

While both the Government of Saskatchewan and Christ the Teacher Roman Catholic Separate School Divisions have filed appeals on this

ruling, the Notwithstanding Clause is being invoked now so parents and students can be assured they will continue to be funded to attend their school, without having the uncertainty of waiting for the outcome of an appeal.

Following legislative amendments that have now been introduced in the legislature, small businesses in Saskatchewan will soon have the highest income threshold in Canada. Effective January 1, the provincial small business income threshold is increasing from \$500,000 to \$600,000.

The threshold is the amount of income up to which small businesses pay tax at the much lower two per cent small business tax rate.

Increasing the income threshold to \$600,000 provides Saskatchewan small businesses with an incentive to hire more workers and invest new capital right here in our province. Meanwhile, rates for personal income tax in Saskatchewan continue to be reduced, which also helps create jobs.

These amendments will implement business income tax initiatives announced in the October Throne

Speech. This includes returning Saskatchewan's general corporate income tax rate to 12 per cent (a half-point increase), effective January 1, 2018—matching the rates of the other western provinces.

Saskatchewan has a strong history of men and women serving in Canada's Armed Forces, and our government acknowledges and thanks them through the Scholarship of Honour.

This token of gratitude and respect gives eligible returning members, as well as the spouse and children of injured or fallen members, a \$5,000 scholarship towards their post-secondary studies.

Our government recently acknowledged 22 new recipients.

One of this year's recipients, Mark Giroux, wrote that the Scholarship of Honour "enabled me to learn the skills that will greatly assist me with my transition to the civilian workforce when I am released from the military."

Since 2009, 183 scholarships have been awarded, totaling \$915,000. Nineteen of these recipients are family members of injured or fallen Canadian Armed Forces Members.

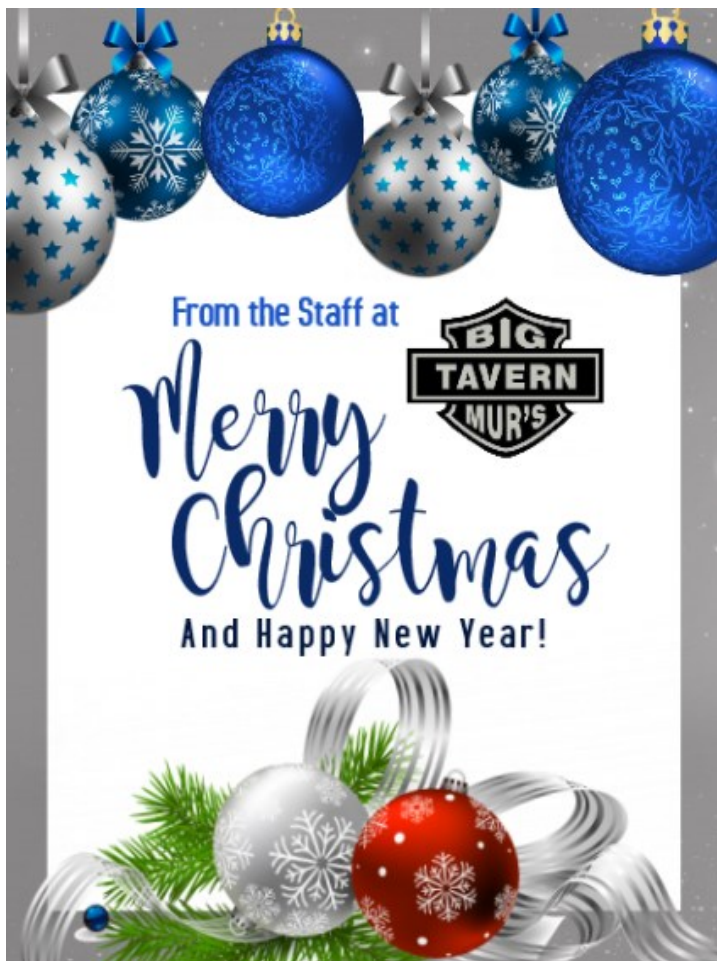

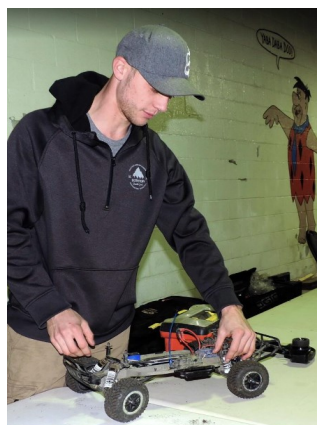

Chocolate Slice Cookies



INGREDIENTS

1/2 cup unsalted Butter
1/2 cup icing sugar (sifted)
3 large egg yolks
1 cup cake flour
1/4 cup cocoa powder
2 Tbsp cornstarch
1/2 tsp salt
Icing sugar, for dusting

DIRECTIONS

1. Beat the butter and icing sugar until smooth, then add the egg yolks all at once and beat until well combined.
2. In a separate bowl, sift the flour, cocoa powder, cornstarch and salt.

Add this to the butter mixture and stir until evenly combined. Shape the dough into a log about 2 inches in diameter.

3. For icebox cookies, preheat oven to 325 F. Line 2 baking trays with parchment paper.
4. Cut the dough into slices about 1/8 inch thick and arrange them on the prepared baking trays. Bake for about 12 minutes, until they are no longer shiny. Once cooled, dust the cookies with icing sugar.
5. The cookies will keep in an airtight container for up to 4 days.

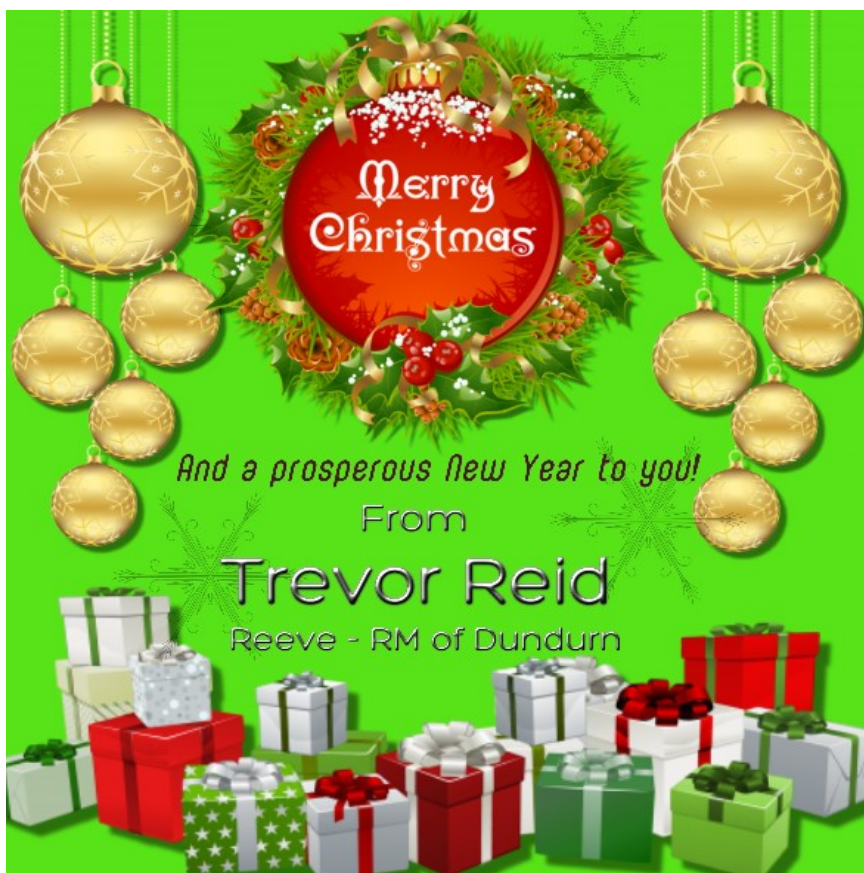

“And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be taxed. (And this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria.) And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city” (Luke 2:1-3, KJV).

There’s the word – “taxed” – we show such disdain for and yet, then as now I suspect, accept the reality of its intrusion upon our livelihood with dutiful obedience and resigned acceptance of less take home pay. But whether it is Rome or Rideau Hall, Caesar or Cabinet capturing the headlines, someone else is at work, always.

Alexander the Great had provided a common language through his export of Greek culture. to that group of shepherds on the countryside around Bethlehem resonate afresh in your heart: “Fear not.”

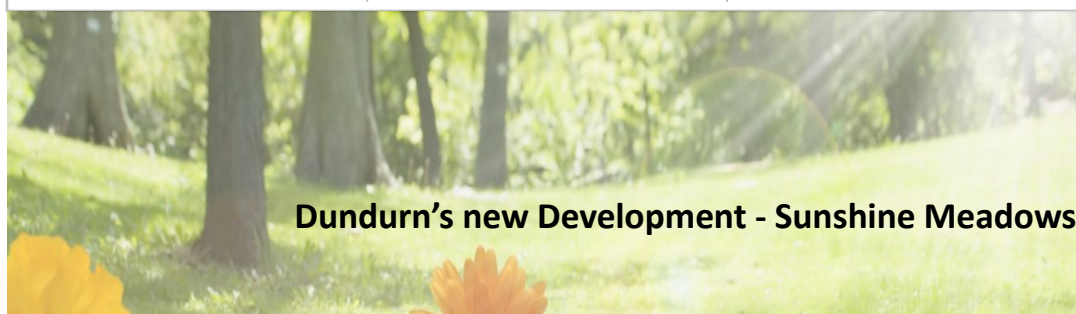
