Military Base about the possibility of working together to have housing available for military personnel in Town. We look forward to helping in any way we can.

Curtis Boyes attended our March Council Meeting. He expressed an interest in becoming involved in formulating an Emergency Response Plan for us. He also volunteered to be our EMO Co-ordinator. Thank you, Curtis.

We had a meeting with the reps from several radio stations in Saskatoon. We are working on a marketing strategy for our Town and we are looking at getting some advertising done on the radio stations.

There are persistent rumours floating around out there so let me put some of them to rest. I am hearing rumours that there are plans in place to build a

satellite fire hall in the north end of the RM and that land has been purchased for that. The Town has not been approached about this. I am not convinced that there are enough vehicles to warrant two fire halls.

I am still hearing rumours that the Town was approached by the Co-op about putting a card-lock in Town.

Simply...not...true. The Town was never approached about this. Think about it. Where do we have the space required for such an undertaking? I remember the Town being accused of turning away business when this rumour started. It is unfortunate that it resurfaces. Apstill parently, some one is still trying to discredit the Town.

In one instance, we did "turn away" a business. That was when Brigthtenview approached the Town with their project on the big so-called "Mall". In Town we did not have the 160 Acres they were asking for, so we referred them to the RM. We did suggest to them that they talk to the owners of the land across the highway.

I am also hearing rumours out there that the RM "owns" the Fire Department vehicles. That is simply not true. The Agreement is that the RM insures the vehicles and the Town insures the buildings and equipment.

An open house was held regarding the new proposed rink for Town. It was well attended, and a Steering Committee was formed to promote the project. Let's give them the support that they need to succeed in this endeavour.

The process of each municipality of taking over their respective wastewater infrastructure is ongoing.

AWARENESS RALLY 2018 ANNUAL SLOW DOWN & MOVE OVER

On the evening of March 7th, the Dundurn Fire Department, along with tow trucks from Brad's Towing, KMS Construction, municipal trucks from the Town of Dundurn, Resort Villages of Thode and Shields, and the Dundurn Rural Water Utility lined up along the shoulders of Highway 11 South & North and stood at attention for one hour to show respect to fallen members and to raise awareness to the public to SLOW DOWN AND MOVE OVER.

The gathering was to raise awareness on an important law. To keep emergency responders, police, road construction, and tow truck drivers safe on our highways. The law requires drivers to slow down when lights are flashing on vehicles. Legislation passed Sections 204(1) and 205(1) of the Traffic Safety Act in October of 2015 stating:

"Slow to 60km/h or less except when on a divided highway and on the opposite roadway from the vehicle in question"

SK Government Insurance also published safe highway driving tips.

• Emergency vehicles always have the right of way when

displaying flashing lights and sounding sirens,

- Motorists must slow down to 60km/h when in construction zones, when passing a worker, flags-person, or equipment occupied by a worker.
- You must also slow to 60km/h when passing Ministry of Highways & Infrastructure equipment (snow plows), whether parked or in motion, when the warning lights are on, and
- Approached by an emergency vehicle with its lights on sirens activated, you are required to move as close as possible to the right side of the road.

The awareness rally started at 7 pm with parked equipment and vehicles activating their emergency lights while operators stood professionally by their vehicles with hats off. The

lights remained on until 8 pm. Fire Department spokesperson Reaschelle Higginbotham stated, "This is an important law. I know at times it seems frustrating to have to slow down or stop for an emergency scene but we promise that we aren't doing it for you. We are doing it for us. At emergency scenes, we are often so focussed on providing necessary assistance that we sometimes lose awareness of additional hazards around us. We've had vehicles drive highway speeds inches from where we are on the highway. We've also had vehicles crash into the back of stationary emergency trucks because they could not slow down in time. Please slow down to at least 60km/hr and have patience. Please help return us to our loved ones at the end of each call."

## A DEDICATED GARDNER DWELLS WITHIN

With gardening season just around the corner, preparations are underway at greenhouse nurseries across the province. Darla Holland can attest to this, as owner and operator of Holland Garden and Greenhouse, she's been busy coordinating her life around the deliveries of plants and gardening accessories since the beginning of March.

Darla and her husband, Rod, were busy picking up shipments from Saskatoon and bringing them home to the greenhouse which is located on the family farm southeast of Hanley. They have received crates of plants, plugs, and cuttings totalling 27,000 plants. Darla has plenty of help from family and friends in preparing for opening day. Her entourage helps with transplanting, weeding, tending to the trees, mixing dirt, and arranging the greenhouse – basically assisting wherever help is needed!

When the shipments arrived, Darla started the process of biological dipping on each of the plants. This process is a preventative measure against root and airborne diseases and

is meant to kill any bugs or larvae that may be living on the plant. This early process helps to prevent the spraying of pesticides later in the season as the plant's mature.

Holland Garden and Greenhouse officially opened in 2014 and after a successful first year, Darla decided to introduce workshops in 2015. The classes include: Succulent and Foliage Planters, Mother's Day Baskets, Fairy Garden's, Fill Your Own Pot and Planter Arrangements. A water bowl workshop is being introduced this year that features an aquatic plant bowl. Succulent and foliage workshops begin in April, with the first being a succulent workshop on April 7th and more to be scheduled in the coming months. Darla will be hosting multiple Mother's Day Basket workshops in April as well. She commented that "customers are invited to store the baskets they created at the greenhouse until the date draws near to Mother's Day."

What Can Your MP Do for You?

Some people are under the false I mpression that MPs don't do much except show up to

vote in Ottawa. The reality is that MPs and our staff have very busy jobs working on behalf of their constituents in a wide range of ways. MPs are public servants so it's important that everyone in the Moose Jaw-Lake Centre-Lanigan constituency understand the services my office can provide.

The first and most important job an MP's office provides is as a liaison between the public and government departments. If you have a problem with a federal government department, you are of course free to deal directly with that department and that's probably the best place to start. But dealing with federal bureaucracy can be confusing and frustrating. My staff has extensive experience with the ins-and-outs of

government and have a number of personal contacts – they know the right places to go to speed problems along. Of course, we cannot guarantee that we can always fix the problem but it can save you a few steps.

Some of the areas in which my staff can help you include:

- Canada Pension Plan
- Old Age Security
- Passport Canada
- Employment Insurance Benefits
- Citizenship and Immigration
- Canada Student Loans
- Canada Revenue Agency
- Guaranteed Income Supplement
- Veterans Affairs

My office can also help if you are part of a group that will be representing Canada abroad. For example, if you are a teacher leading a class trip to another country, we can arrange for Canada pins and flags for students to either wear themselves or give as gifts.

Even though I am not a member of the government, it is my responsibility to represent the federal Parliament of Canada at any special occasions or events in the constituency. If you have an event that you would like me to attend as your MP or to send greetings, please email me an invitation.

If you or a loved one is approaching a milestone birthday or anniversary, please feel free to contact my office to request special greetings. Depending on the milestone or event, congratulatory messages can be arranged to come from me, the Leader of the Opposition, the Prime Minister, the Governor General or, in certain very special circumstances, Her Majesty the Queen.

Finally, we are here to help you make your voice heard in Ottawa. If you have a concern, letter or petition that you would like brought to the attention of the federal government, please let us know and we would be happy to assist.

## COMPLEX STEERING COMMITTEE EVENING DRAWS ATTENTION

On March 8<sup>th</sup> the Town of Dundurn hosted a meet and greet to residents of the Town, RM, Shields & Thode who expressed interest in joining a steering/fundraising committee to help continue the new Sports Arena project in town. Mike Kuzma was the MC for the evening and he along with Town Councillor Annette Hamilton, produced a slide show of project highlights along with some history of how the current Dundurn Sports Centre was built.

Several long-term residents of the RM were on hand and remembered that the current arena started with a grass roots community effort with several committee members putting up their homes as collateral for the loan with one farmer donating a quarter of land. There were dances, big BBQ's, beef and pork draws, kid's walkathons and donated money. In attendance was Gary Freeden, a long time Dundurn resident, who is well known in the community for his mega skills at selling tickets for hockey fundraising events. Although he said he was there this time just to listen and let the younger gener-



ation handle things, he received a round of applause and recognition from the group for all his past efforts at raising funds.

The town had copies available of their new arena business plan along with some quick note material on what a steering committee is and several renderings of arenas from past presentations. Several idea charts were available for anyone who wanted to participate. Some topics included: Fundraising ideas, Other sporting needs, Location – pros & cons, etc.

According to the plan the project cost is \$6.73 million, and the town believed a loan of \$5.47 would be manageable based on

projected revenues. \$1.26 million would have to be raised from another source such as fundraising/donations. The land and infrastructure is not included in the cost as it will be provided by developers from Sunshine Meadows. Several comments were made that a time limit on fundraising should be in place as there is no point fundraising for years as the cost of the project would increase by any fundraising gains made. The evening was full of positive energy and good discussions on building ideas. At the end of the evening those who wanted to commit on a steering committee submitted their names to be contacted. The town has said they would arrange another meeting with the interested parties in the coming weeks.

## **BLACKSTRAP COVENANT CHURCH - PASTOR ANDY GILKINSON**

It happens to be one of those rare times where April Fool's Day and Easter happen to fall on the same day. It had not passed my attention that there are some, including some of my friends and family, who would see this correspondence as entirely appropriate. The idea of Jesus being physically raised from the dead appears to be an idea so bizarre that it should be considered something akin to an April Fool's Day prank. However, for the Christian person, the resurrection of Jesus is essential to our worldview. The apostle Paul said the following, "if Christ has not been raised, then your faith is useless." (1Cor 15:17). The logic is clear and compelling: If Jesus was not raised from the dead, then Christianity should not be taken seriously and could simply be disregarded as a relic from an unenlightened age.

Personally, the resurrection of Jesus is something that I have wrestled with. However, in my search, I have come to be intellectually and historically convinced that Jesus was physically raised from the dead. Let me share with you two reasons among many. The first is that Christianity started in Jerusalem, where Jesus was killed and buried. To disprove the resurrection, you'd only have to walk a few feet to Jesus' grave. If the resurrection is false, Christianity should not have made it beyond Jerusalem's walls. The second is how the vast majority of the apostles were martyred for claiming Jesus was raised from the dead. In the first century, there was nothing to be gained for the apostles as they shared the resurrection. In fact, as one reads through the New Testament, it is obvious that following after Jesus caused the apostles great pain and suffering. If the resurrection of Jesus was a lie, why give up your life for it? In our age, we have seen groups of people give up their beliefs under much less pressure. Space will not allow me to explain all my historical reasons for belief in detail, but if you are interested in exploring this topic further check out reasonablefaith.org or feel free to contact me to have a conversation. I would enjoy hearing your perspective.

But why does the resurrection matter anyway? Tim Keller observes, "I always say to my skeptical, secular friends that, even if they can't believe in the resurrection, they should want it to be true. Most of them care deeply about justice for the poor, alleviating hunger and disease, and caring for the environment. Yet many of them believe that the material world was caused by accident and that the world and everything in it will eventually simply burn up in the death of the sun. They find it discouraging that so few people care about justice without realizing that their own worldview undermines any motivation to make the world a better place. Why sacrifice for the needs of others if in the end nothing we do will make any difference? If the resurrection of Jesus happened, however, that means there's infinite hope and reason to pour ourselves out for the needs of the world. (The Reason for God, 220). May the church live out the true power of Jesus' resurrection.
