
anything to the project.



Finally, the weather is

getting nicer. Bluebirds, juncos, killdeer, ducks, robins, crows and geese have all been sighted. A good sign that spring is here.

A concern was brought to Council about the traffic on Railway Ave. It was felt that there was too much speeding and that it was becoming unsafe for kids either walking or riding their bikes on that street. (Adults too.) Council considered a digital speed sign with a cost of about \$5,000. It could be used on Railway Ave. and other streets as well. A walking/ biking path was also considered. Council decided not to go with the speed sign. Council had an engineer explore the option of putting in a paved walking/bike path along Railway Ave. on the east side of the street. CN owns the property on the west side of the street. The cost of the path would be approximately \$80,000.

Council is looking for other options.

I attended the RCMP Elected Officials meeting on April 11th. With the weather warming up we can expect to see more transient traffic in Town. Statistics show that most vehicle thefts occur with unlocked vehicles. Keep your vehicles locked to deter theft. The RCMP will be doing their spot checks in Town. You may get a little notice put under your wiper blade informing you that your vehicle was checked by an officer and letting you know if your vehicle was locked or not. The RCMP Officers are all being asked to pick a day to get out and engage the communities and let their presence be known. The RCMP encourages that any suspicious activity be reported. They can not respond if they are not informed.

Councillor Richmond and myself attended a two-day workshop on Conflict Management in Saskatoon. It was a very informative workshop.

I attended an information session in Elbow on the 21st. This was an information session on Aquatic Invasive Mussels (Zebra Mussels). Zebra mussels have showed up in Manitoba, Alberta and Montana. To stop the spread into Saskatchewan we need to be diligent in inspecting boats and trailers coming into the province. There are some check points on our borders at the busiest highways. Please inspect and clean your boat, live well and trailer when travelling between lakes.

Council sent a letter to our DAWWU Corporate Partners stating that we would be willing to meet and discuss our DAWWU issues before we look at third party mediation. The partners all responded stating that they are willing to go to 'binding' mediation. I guess they don't want to sit down and talk about the issues. Council will be considering options on what to do next.

The cousins had always wanted to own a business that involved food, as their love of cooking brought friends and families together for dinners and bar-b-que's. Their passion for creating meals led them to research the food truck industry three

years ago, but realized the investment would be too high and the feasibility wasn't sound.

Initially they hadn't planned on owning a pub! But when they spotted an online advertisement for the sale of a pub in Hanley, they didn't think twice about purchasing the business. The sale went fast stated Royden, "From the moment of seeing the ad to ownership was about 3-4 weeks, it was that fast!"

The two have received an

Everything on the menu is homemade, with the exception of the appetizers and 2 out

of the 8 dipping sauces.

Jimmy stated "Merchandising is in the works, as people are wanting to buy our sauces, and expanding the building to include VLT machines and a kitchen to cook in." Right now they are changing up the colours to Rider green. The two want O'Hanley's Den to be a true Rider Den.

Four and a half miles east of Hanley is a hidden gem, Brightwater Greenhouse, owned and operated by Judy and Calvin Pauls. The nursery has been in operation for the past 21 years, and this time of year the Pauls are ramping up for an exciting new growing season. The greenhouse is full of

vegetables, annuals, and succulents - all ready for the picking!

When the Pauls first relocated to the farm in 1987, they had no idea that they would be opening a greenhouse! Judy was working at the thriving nursery DayGrow Greenhouse, and it was while



she was employed there that she learned about the greenhouse industry from DayGrow owner Brian Day. Judy and Calvin's love of gardening led them to decide to build a greenhouse on their property. As Brian mentored Judy at DayGrow, he encouraged them to build, even becoming their consultant.

They broke ground in 1996, building a 3000 sqft greenhouse and opened their doors to the public a year later. The following six years were a work in progress at Brightwater as they expanded by building a header house and two smaller greenhouses, to what it is today!

For the past five years, Brightwater has hosted a "Pumpkin Growing Contest" with all proceeds from the entries donated to the Ronald McDonald House (RMH) in Saskatoon, Brightwater donates annual flowers to RMH as well. Each spring the gardener from the facility makes his trek to Brightwater Greenhouse to choose a variety of plants, and when the time comes for planting, Calvin loads up the back of his truck and delivers the goods.

They officially open their doors for gardeners on May 1st. Their hours are Monday to Saturday 10 am to 8 pm, and on Sunday's from 12 pm to 4 pm. 

Latest from the Legislature

Over the past decade of growth, Saskatchewan's expanded

exports and new business investments have given our province the second-fastest rate of job creation and one of the lowest unemployment rates in the country. The 2018-19 Saskatchewan Budget will help to ensure Saskatchewan's economy stays on track, as we begin another decade of growth.

New business incentives in the 2018-19 Budget include the Saskatchewan Value -Added Agriculture Incentive under the Ministry of Trade and Export Development, and the Saskatchewan Tech Start-up Incentive under Innovation Saskatchewan.

The Saskatchewan Value-Added Agriculture Incentive creates a 15% non-refundable and non-transferable tax credit for new or existing value-added agriculture facilities that make a minimum capital investment of \$10 million to expand productive capacity. This fosters a competitive business environment and improves investment attraction and retention outcomes.

This year's budget also helps to ensure that our energy and resource sectors continue to lead the way by enhancing our oil and gas regulatory programs and by introducing a new Mineral Development Strategy that will encourage more exploration and help protect jobs.

The Fraser Institute has ranked Saskatchewan second out of 91 jurisdictions in the world for mining Investment attractiveness. Preliminary estimates indicate that the value of Saskatchewan's mineral sales for 2017 was about \$6.5 billion, up slightly from the year before, and the province remains a global leader in uranium and potash production.

Oil and gas is responsible for an estimated 15% of Saskatchewan's gross domestic product, and recent numbers—such as increased production, exploration, and revenue—have shown clear signs of renewed activity and

growth in the industry. Saskatchewan is the second-largest producer among Canada's provinces, accounting for an estimated 12% of the nation's crude oil production.

The world needs our energy, but our province has serious concerns that destructive policies and a lack of action from the federal government are doing more harm than good, making Canada an unattractive place for investment.

We have announced that Saskatchewan will join Alberta in introducing legislation to "turn off the taps" in order to put pressure on the BC NDP government to get the Trans Mountain pipeline built. The energy sector provides hundreds of thousands of jobs, billions in royalties and taxes that fund important public services, and major infrastructure such as highways, schools, and hospitals. Canadians depend on this sector's success. We need the federal government to step up to ensure investment is welcomed and encouraged in our country. Thousands of Canadian jobs and billions in additional economic activity hang in the balance.

Experience-'ing' Life

Do you walk, bike, climb, skate, ski, swim, hunt, or camp? Have you dined out, purchased a vehicle (or furniture), frequented a mall or a store, celebrated someone's special occasion at a favorite restaurant, or traveled to a desired destination? If you do, have, or are contemplating any of the above. you are likely confirming what I am being told authors, Joe Pine and Jim Gilmore, in their book, The Experience Economy, have uncovered: Whether its activities or the appetite, movement or a meal, people today want the 'ing' present in their experiences. In a vehicle, we want a driving experience; with new furniture, a sitting experience; a trip to the mall morphs into a shopping experience. We are into walking, biking, swimming, and camping with guality products obtained and used for the purpose of enhancing our experience and pleasure. We want our lives to be brimming with enjoyment and fulfilled

expectation.

I believe such an approach as this has some merit when considering our spiritual life also. Jesus promised in John 10:10, "I have come that they might have life, and have it to the full." (Today's NIV) However, proclamation usually bests practice when it comes to Christianity. More to the point, our rational expression of the Christian faith often trumps its relational counterpart. We use apologetics and arguments to advance our Christian faith more than participation and passion for, in, and with life. This ought not to be. And it is not an either/ or consideration. Genesis 2:16 (eat freely) and Revelation 22:17 (drink freely), book end the entirety of God's revelation to us. And yes, in between is a diagnosis of our human condition which is not flattering in its appraisal of us (read 'all have sinned'), yet guilt is not the goal and judgment is not the final word uttered to us. "I have come

that they might have life, and have it to the full" is what Jesus Christ promises to us. In acknowledging my condition (as the Bible says, I am a sinner), coming to Him in repentance (which is a turnaround in life, not sinless –read 'saint required' – perfection attained first), and asking Him to come into my life and be my Savior, experience-'ing' the Christian life then becomes reality. There is much to learn but never forget, it is life to be lived!

In conclusion, allow me to offer two experience-'ing' expressions of this spiritual life which will result. Lov-'ing' is the first one, for it is how our Lord said others would truly know we are His followers (John 13:35). And forgiv-'ing' is the second. When we forgive as we have been forgiven, we most authentically mirror our Father in heaven (Ephesians 4:32).


