UPGRADES TO WILSON MUSEUM TAKES SHAPE

The Wilson Museum has been undertaking a transformation in the past couple of years. Re-vitalizing the interior, which house the artifacts was the starting point, as displays are now grouped to showcase specific generations, culture and art.

This year the exterior of the Livery barn, the Lahoda homestead, and the one room school are getting a facelift.

This was possible through a donation by a couple of life-time members. With the extra funding the museum board

decided the exterior of the three outer buildings needed a fresh coat of paint.

It was during the third week of August, Ray Moskowec (museum President) along with Al Zip and Frank Brenner from Saskatoon, spray painted the Livery Barn the traditional colour red. White trim will be added once they obtain a lift to reach the height to paint by hand.

Currently the trio are prepping to paint the Lahoda house, and lastly the school. Moskowec stated "wind and heat has been the biggest draw back of getting the painting completed sooner. And age too! We're talking about three guys, two in our late 60's and one who is in his mid-seventies doing the work."

COVID-19 has impacted the amount of money the museum usually raises this time of year. In past year's, the non-profit organization intakes between \$4K to \$6K from campground users and donations. This pays for the utilities and he's thankful the town abates the taxes on the museum property.

Moskowec stated "attendance is down this summer, usually the museum has close to 100 people touring through, but so far this year, the number is down to 25.

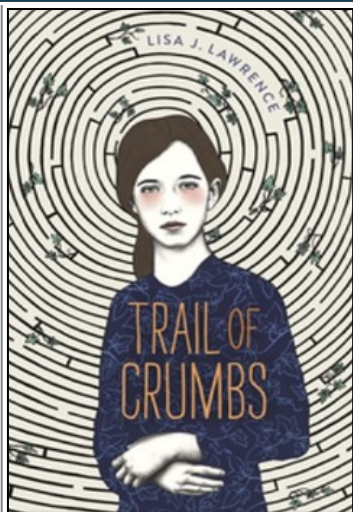
Museums have a lot to offer to their communities, no matter what their focus. You gain an in-depth perspective of a niche region, historical event, culture, and art.

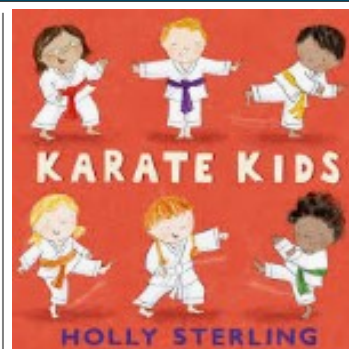

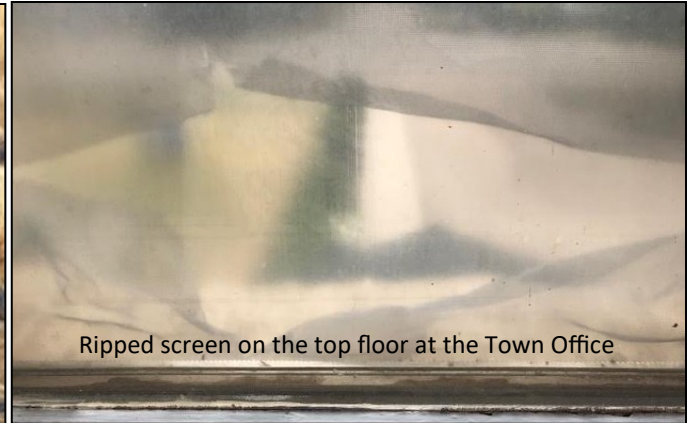

GRANT APPROVAL FOR TOWNS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

On July 27th the Municipal Economic Enhancement Program (MEEP) approved the town's two submitted projects which totaled the approved grant of \$87K. The first project submission was to redesign and construct a new Zamboni room at the Dundurn Sports Center (DSC) and the second project is to install new windows at the Town office. In order to complete before hockey season, construction at the DSC started in the beginning of August and contractors

discovered the wood had rotted in the former Zamboni room and it was full of ants (picture top left), all the black areas were dead ants and feces from the ants. The re-design gave the town the opportunity to make it larger to accommodate the rinks equipment and to change the overhead door position from the north alley opening to face the west instead. The new design will allow the tractor to pull ice out of the rink verses melting the ice in the pit, which would dramatically reduce water consumption, saving a huge amount of money for the center!

Before winter sets in the windows will be replaced at the Town office. For the past ten (10+) years, various Council's have been wanting to replace the windows as they are the original ones when the school was constructed in early 1900's. Most have tears in the screen, cracked panes, zero caulking and none can open to allow ventilation, so it's freezing in the winter and sweltering in the summer. "It's a great building for a town office verses something new built for hundreds of thousands, but some basic maintenance needs to be done to keep it's useful life."

After an extended time off from school due to the COVID-19 outbreak, students are about to resume classes on Tuesday, September 8th for the 2020/21 school year.

Energetic young persons sometimes have a tendency to disregard safety procedures when crossing streets, riding bikes, and disembarking from school busses. It's the responsibility of drivers to be that much more cautious around those buses and school

grounds and observe speed limits and stop signs.

School bus drivers will activate safety lights before stopping to load or unload passengers. More than 75,000 children ride school buses every day in Saskatchewan. When approaching a school bus, if you see amber flashing lights slow down and proceed with caution.

If the red flashing lights are activated, you must come to a complete stop. If you are approaching the bus from the opposite direction on an undivided highway, you must also stop.

With the return to school students and teachers will be subject to new rules. The Government of Saskatchewan in a recent release entitled "Safe School Plans" in order to reduce transmission risk of COVID-19, indicated parents, staff and students can expect to see measures in place to minimize physical contact, encourage proper physical distancing, and increase the cleaning and disinfecting of high-touch surfaces when schools resume in-class learning.

The wearing of masks will be instituted for students in grades 4 through 12 and school staff shall wear masks in

high traffic areas, such as in hallways and on buses. Masks may also be required for students in grades 9 through 12 and staff, in classrooms where it is not possible to maintain physical distancing or if a student has to attend a class outside of their cohort.

If a student or teacher is ill, they should remain at home. Protocols and measures are in place if a child gets sick at school. Full information can be seen by going to www.spritsd.ca and clicking on the highlighted word "Plan" shown as **Government of Saskatchewan media release – Saskatchewan Safe Schools Plan (August 4, 2020)**.

These are the rules in place as of the writing of this article by Dundurn Fire and as situations may change these procedures and practices are certainly subject to adjustment. Let's all be safe and healthy.

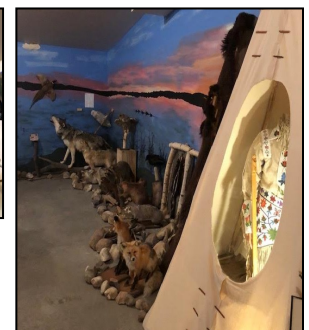

SUMMER TIME

GRILLING

Summer usually means wanting to spend as much time outside as possible in the nice weather and wanting to spend as little time in the kitchen heating up the house and causing the a/c to go into overdrive. Both of these desires are why grilling is such a great option and don't feel like you have to save grilling for weekends or parties: There are plenty of easy, simple recipes here you can make for a quick weeknight dinner.

Summer doesn't last forever, and unfortunately, neither does grilling season, but here are a few grilling recipes—

Hot Dogs with Quick Cast-Iron Beans



All you need for this complete meal is a grill, a cast iron skillet, and a mere 30 minutes.

INGREDIENTS

Canola oil, for grill grate
 1 tbsp. olive oil
 1 small onion, diced
 1 (15-ounce) can small white beans, rinsed
 4 plum tomatoes, chopped
 2 cloves garlic, chopped
 2 tbsp. molasses
 Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
 2 tsp. red wine vinegar
 2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
 6 hot dogs
 6 hot dog buns
 Ketchup, mustard, and relish for serving

DIRECTIONS

1. Set up grill for direct and indirect cooking and heat to medium. Once hot, clean and lightly oil grates with canola oil.
2. Heat olive oil in the skillet over direct heat. Add onion and cook, stirring occasionally, until tender, 2 to 4 minutes. Add beans, tomatoes, garlic, and molasses. Season with salt and pepper. Transfer skillet to indirect heat. Cook, stirring occasionally, until tomatoes break down, 15 to 20 minutes. Remove from heat. Stir in vinegar and Worcestershire.
3. Grill hot dogs over direct heat, turning occasionally, until warmed through, 5 to 6 minutes. Grill buns, if desired. Serve hot dogs in buns with beans, ketchup, mustard, and relish alongside.

Green Goddess Dressing

A homemade green goddess dressing makes a summer salad heavenly. It features avocado, fresh herbs, and lemon zest.

INGREDIENTS

1 ripe avocado
 1/4 c. fresh flat-leaf parsley
 3 tbsp. fresh tarragon
 1 tsp. lemon zest,
 plus 3 tablespoons lemon juice
 3 tbsp. olive oil
 1 small clove garlic

DIRECTIONS:

Puree avocado, parsley, tarragon, lemon zest and juice, oil, garlic, anchovies, and 1/4 cup chives in a blender. Season with salt and pepper. Thin with additional lemon juice or water if needed.

Cut remaining chives into 1/2-inch pieces. Toss together lettuce and half of the dressing; arrange on a platter. Top with cucumbers, tomatoes, and remaining chives. Drizzle with remaining dressing. Season with pepper.

Mayor or Councilor Candidate Eligibility

Persons eligible for nomination as a candidate in The Town of Dundurn must meet all the requirements listed:

- Is at least 18 years old on the day of the election.
- Is not disqualified pursuant to this or any other Act.
- Is a Canadian citizen at the time that he/she submits the nomination paper.
- Has lived in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the date on which he/she submitted the nomination paper, AND:
- Has lived in that municipality, or on land now in that municipality, for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the date on which he/she submitted the nomination paper.

Voter Eligibility

To vote in the Town of Dundurn election in Saskatchewan, you must:

- Be a Canadian citizen;
- Be at least 18 years of age and **one** of the following:
- Have lived in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately before election day **and:** lived in the municipality (or on land now in the municipality) for at least three consecutive months immediately before election day; **or**
- Be the owner of assessable land situated in the municipality (or land now situated in the municipality) for at least three consecutive months immediately before election day.

HON. BRONWYN EYRE - MLA SASKATOON STONEBRIDGE-DAKOTA
Report from the Legislature

I hope you all had a great summer. I'll soon be door-knocking in and around Dundurn, so please look out for me and say hello. I would love to hear from you.

Congrats to Mike and LeeAnne Hoeft (3rd place), Michael and Judy Johnson (2nd place) and Colleen Troesch, who won first place in Dundurn's 'Best Front Yard' contest! I recently joined the Facebook group, 'Dundurn This and That,' to keep up to date on community and constituency news.

From the Legislature, the big news this past month was announcing the new back-to-school date of September 8. Our Government also announced we would allocate \$40 million, from the \$200 million provincial COVID-19 contingency fund, for additional costs related to ensuring the safety of staff and students in our schools.

This funding will be allocated as follows:

- \$20 million available to school divisions on an application-basis for pandemic-related costs, including staffing and sanitation supplies.
- \$10 million available to enhance non-classroom options, such as distance learning, to help ensure that immuno-compromised and medically fragile students have continued access to learning across school divisions, available on an application basis; and

- \$10 million allocated to the Ministry of Education to centrally procure masks, PPE and other supplies for school divisions.

This \$40 million in additional funding will match and complement the \$40 million that school divisions already realized in savings during the pandemic, making a total of \$80 million available to school divisions for a safe return to school. School-specific operation plans, around block scheduling, cohorting, and consideration of alternating school days, etc., have now been finalized and were posted online and communicated to parents and students by August 26. Under the new funding made available to divisions, additional staff to reduce class sizes in exceptional circumstances will also be considered.

The province is also working toward daily testing capacity of 4,000 tests by the beginning of September and will continue to offer universal testing for anyone who wants to be tested. Regina and Saskatoon will also introduce drive-through testing sites, which will require only a health card, not a referral. All teachers and school staff are being encouraged to seek testing prior to returning to school and at frequent points throughout the school year. Priority access to testing will be established for teachers and school staff in the coming days, with referrals available through 811.

Targeted school testing is a key focus of the expanded testing plans, which include targeted monitoring, testing of

students with parental consent, and priority testing for teachers and school staff. Participating schools will be selected based on a number of factors, such as the number of students in the school and whether the community is experiencing a recent surge of new cases. In school, public health visits for routine childhood vaccinations will now include COVID-19 testing, where parental consent is granted.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your child's return to school, I encourage you to, first, contact your local school division, as it has created the detailed guidelines and protocols for local schools. Please also feel free to contact my office on this or any other issue.

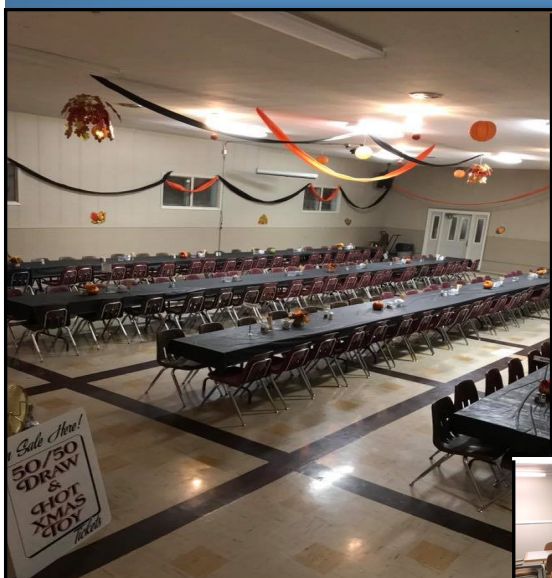

The Dundurn Community Association is looking to fill two (2) seasonal positions. Reporting directly to the Dundurn Community Association and the Public Works Supervisor you will perform a variety of tasks, and liaison with the ice scheduler to maintain/clean ice for rentals.

Must have experience ice making and driving a tractor with a pull type Zamboni and be able to work weekdays starting at 4:30 pm to 11:00 pm and weekends with varied closing hours according to rentals and tournaments.

Overview

- Open Sports Centre on weekends, when required, at approximately 7:30 am to accommodate tournaments or later depending on games
- Close and secure Sport Centre each day at 11:00 pm or earlier depending on rentals.
- Installation of ice and hockey paint markings prior to season opening in October and surface/paint clean up at end of season, approximately March 31.
- Daily air quality testing and reporting weekly to office using forms provided.
- Ensure team dressing rooms are open and appointed to teams for tournaments.
- Clean ice and general ice maintenance.

- Snow removal from all doors, exits and front door asphalt area.
- Perform minor maintenance on whole building as required – (lobby, tractor room, dressing rooms, arena). Includes, changing bulbs, fixing doors, patching holes and painting, cleaning any graffiti, minor plumbing repairs on sinks, toilets, showers, other maintenance as required.
